Update on Adult Dental Program at MCPHC	Kathy McGaha updated the committee members on the Adult Dental Program. Ms. McGaha explained that Dr. Oliver had turned in his resignation, effective at the end of this month.		
	Ms. McGaha stated that Dr. Oliver will operate a dental practice in downtown Franklin and will be accepting Medicaid patients. Ms. McGaha said the Health Department is currently looking for his replacement. Ms. McGaha said one possible option is to use a temporary dentist till a permanent replacement can be found.		
	Ms. McGaha said she wanted to inform the committee members of this situation, since this committee had been so involved in the start-up of both the adult and children dental clinics.		
Federally Qualified Health Centers	Kathy McGaha said that Jerry Hermanson and she had recently attended a regional FQHC meeting in Sylva on June 25 <sup>th</sup> . This event was co-sponsored by the Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust and The Good Samaritan Clinic of Haywood County.		
	Jerry Hermanson said the discussion had centered on a proposed stimulus package to expand FQHC's. The federal government has made money available for newly designated FQHC's; in a two-year funding cycle in an
