	Franklin to discuss their smoking policies. Ms.		
	Hollifield said it has been added to their agenda to		
	discuss at their next scheduled meeting.		
	Ms. Hollifield said that the Town of Franklin has also		
	agreed to let her order No Smoking Signs and cigarette		
	receptacles for future use.		
State Smoke-free	Jennifer Hollifield informed the committee members that		
Worksites and Public	House Bill 2 was signed on Tuesday by Governor		
Places Bill	Perdue. Ms. Hollifield explained that this bill protects		
	citizens from second-hand smoke and will go into effect		
	on January 2 nd .		
	Ms. Hollifield stated that this bill will prohibit smoking		
	in bars and restaurants statewide, with the exceptions of		
	cigar bars and private clubs. Facilities covered under the		
	bill would be required to post signs indicating that		
	smoking is prohibited. Ms. Hollifield explained that		
	enforcement would be through written and oral notices at		
	the local health director's discretion. Ms. Hollifield		
	stated that the bill also prohibits smoking in state		
	buildings and vehicles.		
	Ms. Hollifield also explained that this bill will also allow		
	local governments to adopt laws governing smoking		
	within their jurisdictions that are more restrictive than the		
	state law.
