Introductions	Kathy McGaha asked everyone to introduce themselves and tell what organization they represented.		
Emergency Housing Report	<ul> <li>Rick Westerman reported that he had recently attended a grant writing workshop in South Carolina. He stated this workshop was very useful and informative. He also stated that Habitat for Humanity will have a retreat on September 26<sup>th</sup>.</li> <li>Mr. Westerman stated that three properties are currently being considered for emergency housing purposes. He</li> </ul>		
	stated that the hope is to obtain the properties before the first of the year.		
	Mr. Westerman informed the committee members of a new problem that has surfaced in our community. Several families that rent from out-of-state owners have been evicted from their houses, due to the problem of the owners not making their mortgage payments.		
Family Resource Center Report	Jane Kimsey updated the committee members on the status of the Family Resource Center, with the idea of calling it a Community Resource Center. Ms. Kimsey announced that Senior Services has been approved to move to the old library building. This move would not happen before next year.		

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	Ms. Kimsey said one part of the Senior Center would house the Community Resource Center. Ms. Kimsey said the hope was to have one to two computers for people to access sites like North Carolina Carelink.		
	Ms. Kimsey also reported on the grant that had been applied for that would cover a community resource system including a toll free resource directory phone line for Haywood, Macon and Jackson counties. Ms. Kimsey said that these counties had been awarded a grant for \$67,000 to use for this purpose. There is a possibility 211 could be expanded from Haywood into Jackson and Macon to meet the toll free resource phone line requirement of the grant.		
Soup Café Report	Vanessa Bailey reported that lunch will be added on Tuesday's starting this coming week. Ms. Bailey also said work will also be starting on the building behind CARENET.		
	Ms. Bailey said there is a 17% increase for their services for this year. Ms. Bailey said the item needed most at the current time is an icemaker. Ms. Bailey asked the committee members to keep this need in mind and pass on the need for this item to other community members.		
Macon Transit Information	Kathy McGaha and Jennifer Garrett had a meeting with Kim Angel. Ms. McGaha passed around information she had obtained while at this meeting.		
	Ms. McGaha asked the committee members if they still wanted Ms. Angel to attend a meeting and answer questions and provide further information. After a group discussion, the committee members agreed upon inviting Ms. Angel to attend a future meeting. Ms. McGaha will contact Ms. Angel and invite her.
