	Holly Rogers stated that in Macon County, there is not another organization like this. She explained that HCMC touches many groups and organizations in Macon County and is used in a way to tie all these groups and organizations together.		
	Teresa Mallonee stated that HCMC helps in the prevention of duplication of services, so that different groups and organizations don't work on the same project and compete against each other. Ms. Mallonee also said that HCMC has a wealth of information and has a great ability to gather it.

	that Jerry Hermanson is looking into grants, with		
	the hope of integrating mental health services into		
	both community care clinics in Macon County.		
	• Ms. McGaha informed the committee members		
	that the Primary Care Clinic in Franklin is now open two nights during the week – Monday's and		
	Wednesday's. Ms. McGaha encouraged the		
	committee members to volunteer.		

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	 DISCUSSION Chronic Disease Committee – Teresa Breedlove, Chair Kathy McGaha stated that this committee had been discussing and considering a stronger County Tobacco Policy. Ms. McGaha said the committee members had reviewed laws and examples that have been used in other places. This committee had invited Commissioner Bob Simpson and Vince West to attend a meeting to further discuss this issue. Ms. McGaha updated the Steering Committee members about the Regional Obesity Initiative. Jennifer Garrett and Ms. McGaha have been attending as representatives for Macon County. Ms. McGaha said a meeting will be held in Asheville on October 22nd. This program is being sponsored by MAHEC and is titled WNC Healthy Kids. Ms. McGaha said a meeting had also been held recently with all the county PE teachers. Ms. McGaha said Fitnessgram Program information had been given to them. Ms. McGaha said Macon County is one of two counties to participate in this program. 	with Building Inspections to discuss the topic of		
	universal design. Ms. Southard said she plans to meet with Reggie Holland, a local builder, in the		
	near future.		
	Environmental Quality Task Force – Barry Patterson,

	• Kathy McGaha explained that the members of the		
	task force had recently toured the Coweeta Lab		
	facility. This tour was very informative and new		
	partnerships have since been developed.		
	• Ms. McGaha said the members of this task force		
	have considered different topics to next pursue		
	and voted to next look at water. Mental Health Committee – Jim Bruckner, Chair		
	Kathy McGaha said this committee has not met		
	recently, but with the recent Smoky Mountain		
	divesture issues there have been a lot of changes		
	in our local area.

	undertake the Homeless Count again in January.		
	• Ms. McGaha said this committee is still		
	discussing possible solutions to some of our		
	homeless issues. Ms. McGaha reminded the		

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	 DISCUSSION Steering Committee that there is no homeless shelter of any kind in Macon County. Ms. McGaha stated that some churches in Jackson County had joined together in providing food and shelter during the winter months. Ms. McGaha said this is a possible solution for Macon County. Ms. McGaha said MPP had just finished a strategic planning process, and focusing more on homeless issues is one area that MPP will be concentrating more on. Ms. McGaha also informed the Steering Committee members that the Childcare Issues Committee had recently held a meeting with local businesses and organizations to further discuss childcare issues they face with their employees and their families. Substance Abuse Task Force – Robby Holland, Chair Kathy McGaha said one component of the Wilkes County to review their prescription drug abuse. Several task force members have visited Wilkes County to review their prescription drug abuse program and its success. Ms. McGaha said one component of the Wilkes County program was to encourage all local physicians, dentists and pharmacies to enroll in a state database program that allows them to see what prescriptions for controlled substances have been written for anyone statewide. Barbara McRae said there also have been newspaper articles about Sheriff's in North Carolina also wanting to be included for access to this database. Ms. McGaha said she has scheduled a meeting on September 20th to talk with the AMC Medical Staff about enrolling and using this database. 		FOLLOW-UP

MSgt Mark Pilon and David Hinnant are part of the NCNG Counterdrug Task Force – Drug Demand Reduction. Ms. McGaha said that MSgt Pilon and Mr. Hinnant will be setting up a display table at Highlands, FHS and Macon Middle during Red Ribbon Week. He will visit Nantahala at a later date. Ms. McGaha said an essay contest will also be conducted at Macon Middle.

Youth Risk Behavior Survey Results – Kathy McGaha informed the committee members that a meeting date has been set to release the results of the last Youth Risk Behavior Survey. Resource Center – Sheila Southard reported that the Resource Center has been so busy, that it is now covered by two full-time employees. Ms. Southard also explained the Benefit Bank. Ms. Southard said the Benefit Bank covers any program that federal dollars are connected too, and now anyone can come in and see if they are eligible for those programs. Owen House – Dan Brigman said the current plans are to eventually make the Owen House a Family Resource Center. Dr. Brigman stated that
