Families of children under age three who are at risk for chronic illness or developmental or emotional problems are eligible for Child Service Coordination. Families of children under age five with special needs (diagnosed chronic illness or social/emotional disorder) are also eligible for services.

Hospitals, physicians, other and families agencies, make referrals for services themselves. Within the first two weeks after your referral is received, a Child Service Coordinator will make a home visit to meet with you and your family to discuss your needs. In order to ensure that all of your child's needs are met, your Child Service Coordinator will work with you to develop a plan for your child and family.
