Mr. Grubermann said sometimes it might be cheaper to move or build a new house, rather than remodel an older house to make it senior friendly.</li> </ul>	Sheila Southard will meet with Jack Morgan to get details on constructing a residential living area or converting an existing structure to be senior friendly.
