	Water Law. The seminar covered who really owns the		
	water.		
	Mr. Mason explained that in North Carolina the		
	landowner owns the water and not the state. Mr. Mason		
	said North Carolina abides by a "Reasonable Use Law".		
	Mr. Mason stated that the Department of Environment		
	and Natural Resources is currently developing a strategic		
	plan for water and would like to have better management		
	of the entire water cycle.		
Current EQ Issues	Barry Patterson next briefly reviewed the Current		
	 Environmental Quality Issues: Artesian Wells – Mr. Patterson explained that 		
	an artesian well is an aquifer containing		
	groundwater that will flow upward through a		
	well without the need for pumping. Mr.		
	Patterson said the water pressure on some of		
	these wells is very strong and could blow the		
	well cap off. Mr. Patterson stated that current		
	well rules require the driller and the		
	homeowner to cap and contain the flow or get		
	approval from the state for a "beneficial use"
