One citizen asked if we had anything in place in Macon County to control growth. We need some growth but we should preserve our small town atmosphere at all costs. There is currently no fund that has been set up by the county to buy land to preserve. Kuppers commented that the county had no plans of getting into that business.

One citizen questioned whether or not the comprehensive plan was just another way of describing zoning. Roland assured the citizen that the comprehensive plan was made up of merely recommendations; these recommendations are to serve as a blueprint for future decision makers in the county to follow. Kuppers reminded the group that the people of Macon County that this is only a plan. Kuppers commented that this was the most open process he had ever seen in Macon County. Chairman Nathan Henry wanted to see more celebrations done on behalf of the veterans. Kuppers will bring this before the attention of the board.
